

**More...than**

A sentence based on official question (GMATPrep: *Shipwrecks are more likely to be found...*):

*Studies suggest that couples who make intentional decisions regarding “major relationship transitions” are more likely to flourish as opposed to those who slide through transitions.*

**Analysis:** The correct idiom is *more likely than* and not *more likely as opposed to*. So, the correct sentence would be:

*Studies suggest that couples who make intentional decisions regarding “major relationship transitions” are more likely to flourish than those who slide through transitions.*
